This year marks the third year that SPSG has fielded a winter indoor track and field team. The 2016-17 team was by far the largest and most successful of our past indoor teams as 23 Gators tested their skills in the sprints, long and middle distance runs, jumps, throws, hurdles, and relay events. The highlight of the season came in late January at the highly competitive IAAM Indoor Track and Field Championship meet. The Gators placed individuals and relay teams in 10 of the 15 contested events, scoring 58 team points which earned them a 4th place overall finish in the IAAM B Conference. The team was led by our three All-Conference athletes and individual event champions, junior Anastasia Swetz (1st place -500 m. dash, 3rd place- 4 x 400 m. relay, 4th place - 4 x 200 m. relay, 7th place-triple jump), junior Hannah Stanley (1st place—1600 m. run, 3rd place- 800 m. run) and junior Maddy Riedel (1st place—pole vault). As the winter season and indoor season is a warm up for our spring and outdoor season, the Gators are off to a great start and are determined to compete for the overall team championship at the B Conference Track and Field Championship Meet in May.
